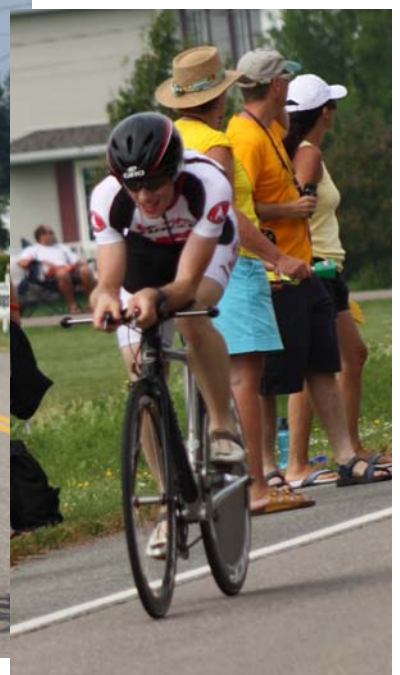

### CYCLING

Tuesday saw another solid performance from Team Yukon at the road cycling venue. In the individual time trial **Jesse Reams and Heather Enders led the Yukon Team to 11<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> place** in the men's and women's events respectively. Jesse powered his way through the 23 km course in a time of 30:44, a mere 31 seconds off the podium. He put in a huge effort and left everything on the road. Heather rose to the occasion and was very happy with her result. She was clocked at 22:09 over the 14 km distance, only 27 seconds off the top 10 women!

**Troy Henry** put in an equally impressive performance coming in **19<sup>th</sup> spot** with a time of 31:08, only 24 seconds behind Jesse. He overtook 3 other riders with authority and managed to avoid flatting. **Ryan Burlingame and David Gonda**, both relative newbies to competitive cycling, **placed 39<sup>th</sup> and 53<sup>rd</sup> respectively** in a field of 62 competitors. On the women's side great efforts were put in by **Kaitlyn MacDonald in 38<sup>th</sup>** (who was on the cover of the local PEI paper), followed closely by **Kelsey Kabanak in 39<sup>th</sup>**. Way to go "guys".

Cyclists have a rest day tomorrow before the grueling final 2 days, when they compete in the road race and exciting criterium!
