Gabor Strikes GOLD

Alexandra Gabor declared on Tuesday after winning her Bronze Medal that we could expect Gold in the coming days. Twenty-four hours later she was true to her word claiming the first ever Gold medal for Yukon at a Canada Summer Games. In an exciting 400 Meter freestyle final, Alex went out in third place waiting until the 150 meter mark to take the lead and refusing to relinquish it despite a charge from two Ontario swimmers in the last 25 meters. Yukon fans went ballistic proving our fans can hold their own with the big boys. The evening finished off with the 4 X 100 meter freestyle relay. Alex led the girls team off with a fast 100m to take the lead, Hayley Bielz, Molly Purser and Kirsten Berube, each swam fast for an overall third place finish in their heat and 11th overall. The boy's team took to the pool next with Brice Harding leading off, followed by Tanner Cassidy, Spencer Sumanik, and Josh Kelly bringing the team to the wall for a third place finish in their heat and 11th overall. The momentum should carry over to day three as more medal possibilities await Yukon. A history-making day at the pool!!!

VOLLEYBALL

The men's final round robin match saw Yukon take on Saskatchewan. Aiden Love had 22 assists setting up Derrick Anderson for 4 and Kaleb Dawe for 14 kills. Steady defence by Dawe (8 digs) and Jake Schneider (5 digs) allowed for some offensive play. Unforced errors added to the loss allowing Saskatchewan to take the match 25-17, 25-19 and 25-15. The team will now regroup and captain Torey Wiebe will lead them into the Placing Round at 12:00 noon today.

The women faced New Brunswick where Team Yukon had some great runs throughout the match that kept New Brunswick on their toes. The coaching staff has been very pleased with the performance and team support from their bench. Some of the depth of the bench was used today as Erin Borgford stepped in and made a pressure serve to shift momentum for the team. Jessica Borgford was able to step in and hold the power side with 4 attacks and 2 digs. Kendra Thomson had another strong match with 32 attacks and 8 kills.

In the final match for the women's round robin play had Yukon take on Quebec. Team Quebec had experience and size taking the match in three straight sets 25-10, 25-7 and 25-10. For the Yukon, Thomson had 22 attacks with 4 kills. Nguyen (8 AT), Yanson (3 AT) Hidingier (4 AT), Waddington (4 AT) and Rivest (6 AT) all added to the offence.
